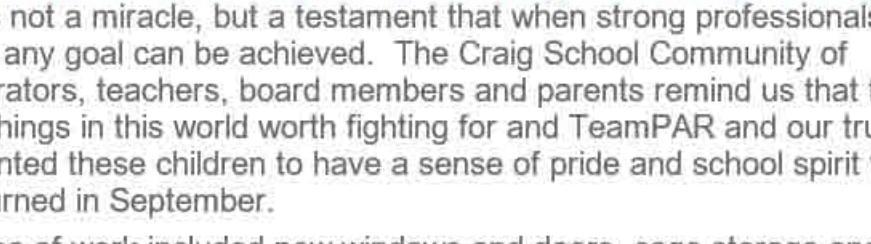

HOME OF THE BADGERS!

The Craig School, Mountain Lakes, NJ

PARsolutions was hired to design, rebrand and renovate the gymnasium for the deserving middle school students attending this independent school in Mountain Lakes, NJ. They purchased this building from the former Wilson School and through the generosity of The Reeth Family, an alumni of the school, TeamPAR was able to turn their desire and dreams into reality in less than 120 days!



TeamPAR remained on schedule and in budget from start to finish. This was not a miracle, but a testament that when strong professionals band together any goal can be achieved. The Craig School Community of administrators, teachers, board members and parents remind us that there are still things in this world worth fighting for and TeamPAR and our trusted allies wanted these children to have a sense of pride and school spirit when they returned in September.

The scope of work included new windows and doors, cage storage and a mezzanine storage system built over a small storage room to remain. Existing wood floors were sanded and restored with new game lines, keys and center court logo painted to initiate the fresh branding initiative. The latest bleachers, score board, basketball backboards and wall to wall matting were supplied and installed. The gym was painted from top to bottom with a signature stripe added and the exposed metal rafters turned red. A new entry half wall was erected and a welcoming "Home of the Badgers" monogram wall was created with tiger stripes to create school spirit and to bring joy to this middle school gym that is used for multiple purposes throughout the day.

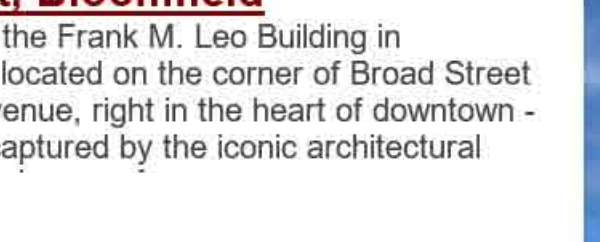


New Jersey's Icons #2 - #5!

From Innovators to Icons

Icon #2 - The Vail Mansion, 110 South Street, Morrisotwn - Then & Now

Between the years of 1916 and 1918 an Italian Renaissance Palazzo-Style mansion was erected in the heart of Morristown. This estate was the vision of Theodore Vail, the President of The American Telephone and Telegraph Company & "chief architect" of the bell system.



Icon #3 - The Frank M.Leo Building, 2 Broad Street, Bloomfield

Take a drive past the Frank M. Leo Building in Bloomfield, N.J. - located on the corner of Broad Street and Bloomfield Avenue, right in the heart of downtown - and you may be captured by the iconic architectural configuration.



The historic Leo Building, erected by and named after New Jersey real estate developer Frank M. Leo, closely resembles the famous Flatiron building in New York City and the Bulfinch Hotel building in Boston with its unconventional triangular, wedge-like shape.

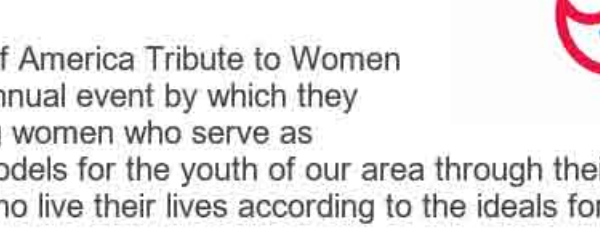
Icon #4 - Lucy the Elephant, 9200 Atlantic Avenue, Margate

Yes, indeed. That is a giant elephant standing along the shore of the Atlantic Ocean in beautiful Margate, New Jersey. She overlooks the water with her big, curious eyes and has an ornate seat - called a howdah - perched atop her back.



Icon #5 - Thomas Edison's House & Laboratory: 211 Main Street, West Orange

New Jersey is home to some of the most famous people in the world, including Bruce Springsteen, Buzz Aldrin, Frank Sinatra, Grover Cleveland and, of course, the inventor of the light bulb himself, Thomas Edison.
